## Generous Charlotte gives disability families a break

AN altruistic property developer has donated £5,000 to enable a group of young people with disabilities to take part in an activity weekend at Avon Tyrrell near Bransgore.

Charlotte Grobien (pictured left), founder of the charity Give It Away, has spent the last decade supporting youth charities with the entire proceeds of a number of London property renovations. Charlotte, who was made an OBE in 2015, said: "Visiting Avon Tyrrell and seeing the pleasure and enjoyment my donation could offer to families was very special for me.
